Participating in Color Fields are glass artist **Jay Musler** and ceramicist **Bennett Bean**. Bean's sculptural ceramics are pit-fired and embellished with painted geometric patterns enriched with color and gilded interiors. Bean's work is in numerous public collections including the Museum of Fine Arts Boston and the Museum of Modern Art in San Francisco, California. Musler's lampworked and sandblasted glass pieces are aglow with luminous color. His work is in many collections, including the Victoria & Albert Museum in London, The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York and the Corning Museum of Glass in Corning, NY.

Gerbig-Fast's ethereal necklaces are influenced by the ancient and classical arts of the Mediterranean and her abundant use of color is celebrated in her delicate work by using lustrous enamels and gemstones.

Sandra Enterline: Selections. Mobilia Gallery will be highlighting the work of metalsmiths Sandra Enterline and Lydia Gerbig-Fast. Enterline's latest work is comprised of hollow-form constructions of brushed metal with tiny perforations, revealing interiors of shimmering gold, abalone or rubies. Additional work originated from Enterline's installation, "One Thousand Souvenirs," where she explores the encapsulation of memories. Each glass vial pendant "contains a relic of one's past." In one series, the rich red color of rubies is contained within a glass pendant, encased within a silk box. Her work is in numerous collections including The Oakland Museum of Art, Oakland, CA, The Museum of Art and Design, New York, NY, and The Racine Art Museum, Racine, WI.
